POLICY ON THE USE OF OXFORDAQA INTERNATIONAL QUALIFICATIONS MATERIAL

GENERAL

All OxfordAQA International Qualifications publications - including, for example, specifications, question papers, mark schemes, coursework guidelines and marking criteria and chief examiners' reports - are subject to copyright and may not be reproduced in whole or in part without the prior written consent of OxfordAQA International Qualifications.

OxfordAQA International Qualifications require a minimum of four working weeks to process applications and will take seriously publication of any OxfordAQA International Qualifications material without permission. Please note that during the summer months (June to late August) the examination process takes priority at OxfordAQA International Qualifications. In order to avoid delays it is strongly recommended that authors and publishers do not send requests for copyright permission to OxfordAQA International Qualifications at this time; if this cannot be avoided, requests should be submitted earlier as they are likely to take a longer period to process.

OxfordAQA International Qualifications will not allow questions to be reproduced before they are available on the OxfordAQA website, so a period of at least one year should be allowed between the date of the examination and reproduction in a published work.

It is not possible to give permission for the reproduction of specimen questions as they have not been tested in a live examination situation and have not undergone the usual rigorous checking procedure. The only exception to this rule will be in the case of entirely new specifications where there is no other material available.

Publishers applications must be accompanied by copies of the questions/material they wish to use: this will speed up the checking process.

All publications must comply with the **OxfordAQA International Qualifications conflict of interest policy**, see below.

QUESTION PAPERS AND MARK SCHEMES

OxfordAQA International Qualifications will not grant blanket permission to authors or publishers to reproduce unspecified questions/schemes or complete question papers but will consider written requests relating to individual questions/schemes under the following conditions:

- Questions may not be quoted in books which consist wholly or even mainly of exercises, questions and/or question papers. In addition they may not be quoted in books considered to be overtly exam-focused.
- OxfordAQA International Qualifications material must be for use in books related to OxfordAQA International Qualifications' examinations.
- Questions may not be altered in any way without prior written authorisation from OxfordAQA International Qualifications. If amendments/adaptations are made then please indicate this is the case and attach a copy of the amended version when applying.
- Where worked solutions to questions and/or commentaries on the questions or possible answers are provided, it must be made clear that the author is responsible for the solutions and that:
 - they have neither been provided nor approved by OxfordAQA International Qualifications.
 - they may not necessarily constitute the only possible solutions.
- Any permission given cannot and does not extend to any material within a question which is held in copyright by another body. (This is normally indicated on the examination paper).
- OxfordAQA International Qualifications does not grant permission for the reproduction of complete examination

papers. (This is indicated on the examination paper or in the Acknowledgement Booklet).

- Applications will be considered for permission to reproduce up to 50% of the number of questions of an individual examination paper. This rule also applies to endorsed products.
- An acknowledgement of OxfordAQA International Qualifications' permission must be made in the published book and each individual question should be followed by reference to OxfordAQA International Qualifications together with the year of the examination from which the question is quoted.
- Requests made to OxfordAQA International Qualifications for permission to reproduce examination material must give precise details of the examination (eg International GCSE, AS, A-level), year, subject, specification, paper, section and question number.
- Requests made to OxfordAQA International Qualifications for permission to reproduce questions should state the title, author and publisher of the proposed publication as well as a brief description of the nature and scope of the publication.
- Publishers requiring permission to reproduce OxfordAQA International Qualifications material in a resource pack or similar product which is to be photocopied are strongly advised to contact OxfordAQA International Qualifications at least six months before the date of publication, in order to negotiate fees and conditions.
- On publication, a complimentary copy of the textbook, journal or other publication in which OxfordAQA International Qualifications material appears should be sent to OxfordAQA International Qualifications.
- OxfordAQA International Qualifications will not unreasonably withhold permission for the reproduction of questions and mark scheme extracts provided that the above conditions are met, but does reserve the right to refuse permission without necessarily giving reasons for so doing.

EXAMINERS REPORTS AND SPECIFICATIONS

OxfordAQA International Qualifications will allow brief extracts from examiners' reports, but reproduction of blocks of pages will not be allowed.

OxfordAQA International Qualifications does not encourage the use of extracts from specifications as these are liable to frequent review and the most current versions are placed on [oxfordaqa.com](https://www.oxfordaqa.com). Reproduction in print may therefore become out of date and possibly offer misleading information. It is not usually in the interests of students to have more than one source for specification details.

Requests to use text from both the above categories will usually be charged at the OxfordAQA International Qualifications standard rate unless there are multiple requests for the same publication. Charges will then be at OxfordAQA International Qualifications' discretion.

FEES

Fees have been introduced for requests to reproduce questions from OxfordAQA International Qualifications' examination papers. The standard administrative charge will also apply to requests to reproduce brief extracts of text from specifications.

An invoice for the appropriate amount will be issued with the permission contract. All invoices must be paid within 30 days. Payment must be made in pounds sterling.

ELECTRONIC FORMATS

INTERNET

OxfordAQA International Qualifications does not allow the use its material in any format on any third party websites. In addition OxfordAQA International Qualifications does not allow material to be used in videos for publication on media such as YouTube or Twitter. OxfordAQA International Examination material including question papers may not be shown or the contents read out.

CDS AND DVDS

OxfordAQA International Qualifications will allow material to be published on stand-alone CDs and DVDs according to the conditions in *Question papers and mark schemes* above providing that the publisher and the users of the CD/DVD agree to maintain the integrity of the original material. The publisher will be required to send OxfordAQA International Qualifications a copy of the CD/DVD. OxfordAQA International Qualifications will allow CDs and DVDs to be used within an institution on a site-wide basis subject to the following conditions:

- Use is restricted to 10% of the document in question, regardless of whether the material is covered by an exclusive arrangement.
- The charge for using the materials is double the standard rate for its use in hard copy publications.
- Permission is granted through a license for a period of 12 months from the license date, to be renewed annually.

EBOOKS

OxfordAQA International Qualifications will accept requests for the inclusion of material in eBooks under the following conditions:

- No editorial changes can be made to the eBook.
- Users cannot alter/adapt or print the content of the eBook.
- Users cannot resell or loan the eBook.

APPS

OxfordAQA International Qualifications does not grant permission for the use of its material in apps.

Publishers should note that the OxfordAQA International Qualifications logo is a registered trademark and that the use of the OxfordAQA International Qualifications logo and any reference to OxfordAQA International Qualifications endorsement is only permitted within a contractual arrangement with OxfordAQA International Qualifications.

OTHER PUBLICATIONS

OxfordAQA International Qualifications will also consider specific requests for the reproduction of extracts from its other published material, for example electronic material and video and audio material. As with question papers and mark schemes, details of the particular material for which release of copyright is sought should be given, in writing.

CONFLICT OF INTEREST POLICY

Authors/publishers must ensure that their book or material does not have any of the following:

- references to a partnership with OxfordAQA International Qualifications
- references to the book providing 'complete coverage of the specification'/'all you need' (or similar)
- references to the resource being needed to successfully complete an assessment or qualification
- over-emphasis on examination preparation at the expense of the course content. The main focus of the book must be on good teaching and learning with examination preparation building on this – preferably at the end of the book. Any book which does not adopt this approach and is too heavily exam-focused will find it difficult to successfully complete the approval process
- references to the books being 'written by senior examiners' or 'by the people who will be marking your exam' (or similar). Also, no references to 'the examiner is looking for',

- ‘examiner insights’, ‘examiner commentary’, eg on student exemplars; ‘examiner tips’ or similar inferences
- references to ‘OxfordAQA International Qualifications tips’, advice from OxfordAQA International Qualifications, OxfordAQA International Qualifications comments or what OxfordAQA International Qualifications is looking for
- icons and devices such as ‘grade-boosting tips’, ‘bump up your grade boxes’ or ‘moving up the grades icons’. Also, no revision tips for a particular specification, though general revision tips are acceptable
- references to content ‘helping achieve’ or being appropriate for a particular grade/level
- references as to what students should/should not study and what may come up in any examination
- references to tips on ‘how to achieve certain grades’, or material labelled by level or grade.

Questions can be used (with permission) if they are previous OxfordAQA International Qualifications exam questions or if they are exam style questions – though the latter must be headed ‘Practice questions’. They must not be used if any of the authors is a senior examiner for the specification in question at point of writing.

Mark schemes can be used (with permission) but not if the author is a current senior examiner for the specification in question.

Assessment objectives (AOs) can also be referred to e.g. skills can be developed within student textbooks using suitable headings – but not an extensive use of AOs with all skills matched to them.
